### warden stories

Stories let us share information in a way that creates an emotional connection. They convey culture, history, and values that unite people and act as an entry point to understanding a different experience of the world. With the help of locals like Don Sipes, the Waskesiu Heritage Museum has documented and preserved an impressive collection of verbal history. Enjoy this story as an introduction to the experiences of park wardens (and their families) living and working in the earlier days of Prince Albert National Park.

My name is Don Sipes. I was born at Prince Albert, Saskatchewan in 1944. My first home was Boundary Cabin in the Boundary District of Prince Albert National Park (PANP).

My dad, Ed Sipes was appointed to the Canadian National Park Warden Service in 1943. He, my mother Mabel, and my older brother Dick moved to Boundary that same year. Boundary was the most northerly and remote district on the west side of the park. We moved south to Sturgeon Crossing in 1945 where we resided for nine years. We then moved to Silver Grove on the South Side of the park, followed by a move to Waskesiu Townsite in 1959. My parents suffered hard times during the Great Depression and my dad felt privileged to be part of the Warden Service.

The communities bordering the south and west sides of the park are: Cookson (south of Silvergrove) Stump Lakes(south of Rabbit Cabin) Park Valley and Lake Four (west of Sturgeon Crossing) and Ladder Valley (west of Boundary Cabin). Big River is about twenty miles west of Sturgeon Crossing and Boundary.

My Dad loved a good story and loved to tell stories. Most of the stories I relate here are about our lives in the districts of PANP. Some I only remember because I heard them so I can't vouch for their accuracy. Many of the events from which they came were before I was old enough to remember or I was away at school when they took place. I am sure the stories were embellished as they were told and retold. In some cases, I remember the stories but don't remember the principal individuals involved. A few are from personal experience.


In the course of putting these stories together, I was able to reconnect with others I knew from when I lived in the park: Elsie (Jervis) Jefford, Don Dickenson, Cathy Corrigal, and Ron Davies. I'd like to offer a special thanks to Ron for a number of phone calls in which he provided a few of his own stories and his recollections of the very early days of the Park. Special thanks also to Cathy for graciously sharing her father's notes on early wardens. I hope to do more in the future with the information they provided.

I will do my best to relate these stories as I heard them.

#### **District Life in the Warden Service**

Life in the districts was totally unique not only for the wardens but for their families as well. Prince Albert National Park (PANP) was divided into districts. Each district had a cabin that shared the same name as the district. Wardens were assigned to a district. They didn't follow a regular workweek or work a shift. They and their family were the sole residents of their district and they were responsible for it at all times.

There is something uniquely beautiful about living in wilderness surroundings. A quiet absence of all humanly generated noise and light is something few of us get to experience today. To step outdoors on a cold evening to a choir of bugling elk, yowling coyotes, and howling wolves makes the hair on the back of your neck tingle. Bright starry skies and intense northern light displays whose whisper you can hear are unforgettable.

Access to schooling was the biggest hardship. My older brother Dick rode about five miles on horseback to school at Rapid Bend, Lake Four, and Park Valley - an arduous trip at minus 40°F. I started boarding away from home at age six. I'm sure my mother shed more than a few tears of concern.

We lived without electricity, refrigeration, running water, or indoor bathrooms. At the time, we didn't see those things as hardship. We just lived in ways that made those facilities unnecessary.

We had a battery powered Stromberg Carlson Console radio and a long wire antenna. With no electrical interference, you could truly tune in the world: radio plays from the BBC in London and fights from Madison Square Garden in New York.

The isolation and social distancing experienced by people during the COVID-19 pandemic lockdown were once our normal and it didn't bother us at all.

The Warden Service was a quasi-military institution. Wardens wore a uniform, followed a chain of command, and were subject to inspections for the results of their responsibilities.

Wardens were law enforcement officers. Their primary role was to enforce the National Parks Act of Canada which required them to protect the Park, its wildlife, and its property. However, the job often involved much more.



# keeping wildlife wild

Keeping wildlife wild is a shared responsibility - we all have a role to play!

The chance to observe wildlife in their natural environment is one of the most fascinating experiences that Prince Albert National Park has to offer. Along with this opportunity comes the responsibility to treat wildlife with respect and to share these natural spaces safely with them.

When an animal learns to associate people with food, or becomes "food conditioned", the animal will frequent areas that are unsafe and may begin to adopt bold or aggressive behaviours towards people. This puts the safety of people and the animal at risk. Because of this, feeding wildlife in a national park indirectly by leaving food unattended, littering or not properly disposing of garbage, or directly by offering them food, is illegal under the Canada National Parks Act.

We thank you for storing all food, scented items and garbage appropriately, such as inside your accommodation building, vehicle, hard-sided RV or by using a designated storage facility provided by Parks Canada, for not littering, and for disposing of garbage into bear-proof garbage bins.




# what is mahjong?
