faces of the lakeland

Faces of the Lakeland are back! We are excited to give you a glimpse into the lives of local people in and around the Lakeland Area. Watch for this feature throughout the summer!

The writer, Jacquie Moore is a book author and freelance journalist. She and her husband Scott have a cottage in the woods at Emma Lake.

If there's one thing that living through a global pandemic can teach us, it's learning how to adapt and figure out ways to live differently. From grocery shopping, to socializing, to working from home, many regular rituals have had to be modified. At Christopher Lake school, the staff and students have been getting a crash course on adaptation. During the lockdown, classes have been taught remotely, through online technology; a first for most teachers and students. And for Principal Dejan Letkeman, there have been even more significant firsts: his first principalship, and his first year at Christopher Lake School.

While it's his first year at the school, he is very familiar with the Lakeland area. "I was born and raised in Prince Albert," says Dejan. "As a child, a teenager, I spent a lot of time in the Lakeland, whether hiking, camping, fishing, canoeing in the national park or Anglin Lake, or just going to the beach at Emma or Christopher. I was even employed at one of the camps in the area as a kid. My history has been tied to the Lakeland area for as long as I can remember."

After graduating high school, he went to college, then married and relocated to Alberta. Eventually he and his wife came back to Saskatoon where Dejan got his education degree. Following six years of teaching in Lloydminster, Dejan returned to his hometown of P.A. in 2011. He was vice principal at WJ Berezowsky, Meath Park, and Arthur Pechey public schools before starting as principal of Christopher Lake school last August.

Asked what his vision for this school is, Dejan says, "I have a vision as an administrator, that I'm the lead learner in a learning community where we're constantly pursuing personal and schoolwide excellence. So our perspective is that we're all learners, every one of us at the school whether you're a student, a teacher, an EA, secretary, custodian, or the principal. I believe that every school should have that growth mindset where we strive to learn, and strive to be better than we were yesterday. Always growing, always achieving ... I guess that would be my motto for the school."

And during this time of Covid-19, that growth mindset has been put to the test. "Although remote learning is new and it has its challenges for all of us," says Dejan, "I think that teachers really believe in what we're doing. During a crisis like this it's important to continue on with education on so many different levels. Obviously on an academic level, it's important to continue building math and language literacy in our children and that's why teachers are so faithfully engaged in that remote learning."

But the real challenge, Dejan says, comes from the fact that education is highly relational. "Relationship is the context in which education happens and is meaningful - it's hard to teach anything relevant if you don't have that meaningful connection with your kids. In our school, relationships are built and nurtured every single day, it's very family-like, and that togetherness is part of the education. So now, even if

you're having that Zoom or Google meeting, it's just not the same. And also some of our students and families don't have access - or sufficient access - to internet and computer technology. In cases like that, a phone call and mailed paper learning packages are required, but it reduces the connection there."

And, Dejan adds, kids are under a lot of stress right now. "In this time of uncertainty, it's not only traumatic for adults who are dealing with the fear, and the loss of employment, and health concerns, the general unpredictability of what the future looks like, but also the children are in tune with their surroundings and that social-emotional climate. Even if they're too young to know exactly what's going on around them, they certainly sense that something is. And that can also be traumatic and upsetting. As part of our vision of education, we're absolutely committed to keeping that relational connection with our students with whatever means are available to us - Google Classroom or Seesaw or the fun contests we're running on the school Facebook page. In this time, it's our desire to somehow meet the social and emotional needs for connection and stability in our students, the best we can. That's really the challenge during this time."

For many kids, this unprecedented "down time" at home with their families has had some positive consequences. "We're getting a lot of pictures from parents showing their kids learning the art and skill of gardening, and helping dad build a shed, and cooking and baking, and a lot of those domestic things," says Dejan. "There's a Grade 6 student at our school who's been building these planters - his mother's been sending pictures of them - and then he's turning around and selling them ... and they're quite amazing! Stuff like that, learning those skills from their own parents and then making that a part of their day, it's really neat to see."

Asked what skills he's been passing on to his own kids during this time, he laughs. "Well, I'm a teacher by trade so I've been doing a lot of teaching with my 14-year-old daughter, and that's been a neat experience. She's reading the novel 'The Outsider' for her class, so I've been piling it on. She has to do a presentation for us about the 1960s and then we have



conversations about that. Going outside to shoot hoops with my 9-year-old son, showing him how to throw a basketball or going for a hike beside the creek to find tadpoles or frogs - we normally don't get to do things like that."

"Not to mitigate or downplay the trials and hardships of this time," says Dejan, "but I've heard the expression 'The Covid Miracle' floating around, talking about some of those silver linings that exist. There certainly can be some good things found within this storm, so to speak. Whether that's increased time with family, or the ability of parents to spend more time with their kids and show them some things. Even the sense of time slowing down a little bit, and refocusing on things that are important in the grand scheme of things."

At this point, there is still no starting date for schools to resume in the fall. "The Ministry of Education is in the process of figuring it out, but we're not sure what this fall is going to look like," says Dejan. Regardless, however, the staff and students at Christopher Lake School have proven their willingness and their ability to adapt and carry on in the pursuit of learning.

selling at the lake?

A helpful checklist brought to you by local owner and real estate specialist, Rob Pellegrini.

- Contact the municipality and let them know as of what date you are no longer the owner.
- Remember to cancel all utilities that may apply to your area: Sask Power; Sask Energy; Sasktel; Insurance; Internet Service; Water Hauling/ Septic Service - have your septic pumped out the day before possession date.
- Any yard or cottage maintenance contractors need to be notified to stop service. Forward the realtor's information in case they want to continue that service.
- Cancel all automatic withdrawals for related services to do with the property.
- Leave the premises clean and tidy. Make arrangements for all garbage or refuse left behind to be picked up.
- Leave a small notice to new owner. If there are specific ways any system should be engaged or disengaged for a season. This is a very helpful tip for new owners.
- Leave all keys for the property including codes, garage, TV or appliance remotes, manuals, diagrams for sprinklers or systems you may have as a road map for the new owners.
- Make certain that all appliances or inclusions as per the offer are clean and in agreed upon condition.
- Turn off any system that could be damaged if not attended to regularly (i.e. pump, furnace, sprinklers and anything unique to the property. Then make a note for the new owner to follow or be on the lookout for.
- Take all personal possessions that were not included in the agreement and leave what was.
- Do not remove any attached items from walls or ceilings or buildings unless specified in the agreement (i.e. TV mounts and fixtures).
- It is a good gesture to ensure the water supply if a cistern has adequate levels to operate the cabin on possession date.



support for vulnerable populations

The Emergency Community Support Fund (ECSF) is a \$350 million investment made by the Government of Canada to support vulnerable populations as they manage the impacts of COVID-19.

The Prince Albert & Area Community Foundation is among some 150 local community foundations across Canada that are taking part.

The Foundation is accepting applications for funding from qualified donees. Grants can be used for a variety of purposes, including to cover staffing or resource needs, purchase assistance and more. Funding will be issued on an ongoing basis through July 2020. Charities and community organizations are invited to visit communityfoundations.ca for eligibility and application details.

Eligible Projects

Many different types of projects are eligible for funding. Registered charities and other "qualified donees" can apply through community foundations for projects that:

1. Address a well-being need caused by COVID-19.
2. Serve one or more vulnerable groups such as seniors, persons with disabilities, veterans, newcomers, refugees, women, children and youth, LGBTQ2

people, Indigenous people and racialized people, such as Black Canadians and others.

3. Will be completed before March 31, 2021.

Here are only some examples of eligible projects:

- Increased staffing and supplies at a shelter for women and children fleeing violence;
- Food supplies for First Nations members living on-reserve, where supplies and delivery are interrupted;
- Equipment for a food bank to accommodate rise in food orders;
- Technology enabling seniors in-residence to connect with their families virtually;
- Preparing and delivering food for persons with disabilities

Application Process

If you have a project that matches these criteria, the application is designed to be straightforward and efficient.

Applications will be received and assessed on a weekly rolling basis, so that you can get an answer as soon as possible. The final closing date to submit an application will be July 27, 2020.
